ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING REPORT

Despite the arctic conditions the Nepal Trust AGM was held in Edinburgh over the weekend of Dec 4th with intrepid souls arriving from Berwick, Edinburgh, Northern Ireland, Somerset and in Jeroen's case Nepal. We had a quorum, but only just.

Rod Lowcock was formally appointed in his absence as Finance Director, taking over from Tony Robinson. Tony remains a board member and hands the accounting role on to Rod in excellent shape. Pavla Love and Liz Williams

were also both elected as voting members.

Jeroen presented a detailed report on the work carried out by the Trust in 2010 and set out plans for 2011. These include completing current projects including the Ghoti Khola and Chyaduk micro hydro projects both of which are now fully funded.

The plans call for a revamping of the Trust's primary health care programme: 2011 will see investments in upgrading the

Kermi and Yalbang clinics, liaison with the local communities to select locations for two new sub-health posts to be constructed in 2012 and 2013, the recruitment of new junior health care workers, the on-going training of all health care workers and a series of mini health events run through the clinics.

2011 will also see start of the construction of the new Service Centre planned for Simikot.

For 2011 we need help with the refurbishment of clinics, delivering the health care programme, building and running the service centre, monitoring and completing on going projects, community liaison and the planning for

new health posts.

Two volunteer treks "to build" are planned: one in April/May to monitor on-going projects and to liaise with the local community on construction of the new sub health posts: the second in Sept/Oct to lead the refurbishment of the Kermi and Yalbang health posts.

We are also seeking volunteer nurses, dentists and doctors to visit Humla with us in 2011 and assist in the delivery of the primary health care programme.

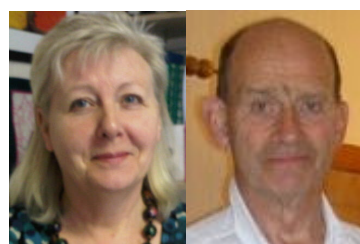
